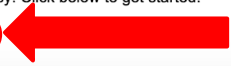

User Registration: Username and Password

The first step to volunteering with Habitat for Humanity Seattle-King County is to register and complete this online application.

Before proceeding, [please review our policies](#) for on-site volunteering to ensure that you and/or your group are qualified and prepared to volunteer with us!

In order to ensure the safety, value of experience, and effectiveness of all of our volunteers we must enforce the following policies:

A) All volunteer shifts must be coordinated with Habitat for Humanity office staff, and volunteers must not show up on site unscheduled. Due to the nature of the work and safety concerns, group size must not exceed that which is scheduled. Unscheduled volunteers may be asked to leave the job site.

B) No one under 16 years of age is allowed on the job site for any reason.

C) All volunteers under age 18 must create an account as well, and have a minor waiver signed by a parent or legal guardian. The waiver will be supplied through this website when signing up for a volunteer activity.

D) All children 16-17 years of age must have an adult chaperone with them on the work site.

E) All individual volunteers must complete the online volunteer application form and agree to the liability waiver before arriving at the job site.

F) All group leaders must complete the online orientation and registration and are responsible for ensuring that all members of their group have also registered online and signed the liability waiver before arriving at the job site. Group leaders must also provide all group members with directions to the site and expectations.

8:45 - 9:00 - Check-in, distribute Personal Protective Equipment

9:00 - 9:15 - Habitat introduction, safety orientation, and description of work assignments

9:15 - Noon - Work under the instruction of Habitat site staff

Noon - 12:45 - Lunch: Please bring your own, if not provided by your group

12:45 to 3:45 - Work under the instruction of Habitat site staff

3:45 - 4:00 - Clean-up and sign out

Suggested Items to Bring:

- Lunch, if not provided by group
- Work gloves
- Water bottle

What To Wear:

- Sturdy shoes that are closed toed, preferably boots (hiking or work boots)
- Long pants and shirts that cover shoulders.
- Layers for all weather possibilities, Rain Jacket.
- Hard hats and safety goggles are required and provided by Habitat on each site.

Non-Negotiable:

For the safety of everyone on site, anyone found wearing any of the following clothing items will not be allowed on the active build site until they are able to change.

No open toed shoes



No shorts



No sleeveless shirts
