

## Constitution and Charter for Israel Forever

### Article I: Name

This organization shall be named Israel Forever.

### Article II: Purpose

The purpose of this organization, hereby referred to as Israel Forever, is to advocate the unequivocal right for the state of Israel to exist as a Jewish entity. In order to achieve this goal, members of Israel Forever will be tasked with actively supporting and representing the state of Israel in public forums. Israel Forever is designed to be a very strong presence on campus in order to raise awareness and promote dialogue concerning the state of Israel. Members will:

- 1) Table on a weekly basis
- 2) Write letters to local and campus newspapers
- 3) Provide factual information on or related to Israel

### Article III: Affiliations

Israel Forever is closely affiliated with StandWithUs and CAMERA. These organizations provide Israel Forever with materials and advice in support of Israel Forever's activities.

### Article IV: Membership

Section 1: In accordance with University of Washington rules, the majority of members shall be regularly enrolled undergraduate and graduate students at the University of Washington. Furthermore, only currently registered University of Washington students have voting rights in Israel Forever.

Section 2: Also in accordance with University of Washington rules, University of Washington staff and non-University of Washington individuals may have associate membership status. However, these individuals will not have the right to vote.

Section 3: In terms of eligibility requirements, anyone can join Israel Forever provided they are willing to support Israel Forever's activities. Any member may be removed by an overwhelming majority (75%) no confidence vote by other active members. This vote would take place at any standard or special meeting.

### Article V: Officers

- Section 1: The officers of Israel Forever shall consist of five (5) permanent seats:
- 1) President
    - a) Duties: The Presidents duties include, but are not limited to, arranging Israel Forever meetings, recording and keeping membership rosters and mailing lists and working with affiliates.
  - 2) Vice President
    - b) Duties: The Vice Presidents duties include, but are not limited to, assisting the President, filling in for any missing officers from meetings and working with affiliates.
  - 3) Web Master
    - c) Duties: The Web Masters duties include, but are not limited to, maintaining and updating the website, searching for new material and checking e-mail.
  - 4) Secretary
    - d) Duties: The secretaries duties include, but are not limited to, taking notes at meetings, searching for new information and proof reading documents.
  - 5) Public Relations
    - e) Duties: The Public Relations duties include, but are not limited to, meeting with other University of Washington organizations, meeting with University of Washington representatives and keeping materials.

Additional officer positions can be added based on one (1) of the following two (2) conditions:

- 1)The individual in question provides a valuable skill set to Israel Forever.
- 2)The individual in question commits to twenty-five (25) hours or more per quarter facilitating and participating in Israel Forever activities.

Section 2: Any individual is qualified for any officer position provided that individual understands and accepts the time and responsibility commitment. It is understood that an officer will spend at least twenty-five (25) hours a quarter working on activities related to Israel Forever and will support Israel Forever's agenda at all times.

Section 3: Term of office for officers is one school year, outlined as October 1 through September 30 for a total of twelve (12) months.

Section 4: If the vast majority (67%) of members of Israel Forever (as defined above) lose confidence in an officer for any reason that officer must be removed and replaced by another member elected by vast majority (67%). The removed officer may be further removed as a member of Israel Forever based on an overwhelming majority (75%) vote.
