Please explain the outstanding contributions of the nominee during the month of nomination

Additionally he helped order the food for the event, arranged to get a car to pick up the food, and picked up the food for the event. Of course, when it was time for inductions he worked with the NRHH Executive Board to set-up the whole room and greet each person as they walked into the room. Yet, the coolest thing by far that he did was make personal nametags for each person to put at their seats. But there weren't just any nametags, these nametags each had a Hawaiian name that Taran researched to find the Hawaiian name for each attendee. The first event that Taran put on was a community service event with Food Lifeline. He made it so that members of NRHH that came to the game were able to go to the film room immediately following the game and be able to meet and talk to the stars of the team and the coaching staff of the game. At the end of the event after members of the team heard about the great work NRHH does, they stated that they would be willing to help at a future community service event.

Furthermore he worked with RHSA and began a third event, a collection drive to get hygiene products to families in need.

While he had an incredible November, I know of nobody that works harder more consistently to ensure the success of his NRHH chapter than Taran Dike.
