ANSWER: Vancouver

[10] Though many of the school scenes were shot in Vancouver proper, the house from the original *Diary of a Wimpy Kid* movies is located in this other city within the Vancouver metro area. This city on the north bank of the Fraser River was the original capital of British Columbia, and is nicknamed "the Royal City".

ANSWER: New Westminster

[10] Though mainly set at the fictional North Seattle High School, the school in the Disney Channel Original Movie *Prom Pact* is actually in this city in metro Vancouver. That school is now named for Terry Fox, who spent his later childhood in this city, which is bordered to the north and west by a larger, similarly named city. ANSWER: **Port Coquitlam**

Answer some questions about the greatest movie of all time, Cars 2. For 10 points each:

[10] This is the character who Mater talks to in his first scene. This friendly lemon comments on making it "halfway to the county line", and is hurriedly towed back to Radiator Springs by Mater upon the latter's learning of Lightning's return.

ANSWER: Otis

[10] Mater sings the jingle of this company upon being told he is an agent by Holly and Finn, mistakenly believing they are insurance agents. This company apparently also sponsors the League of Legends Championship Series. ANSWER: <u>State Farm</u> Mutual Automobile Insurance Company

[10] This is the mustachioed blue tow truck Mater impersonates while in Porto Corsa. This won't help most of you but this character shares his first name with a certain rebellious Cossack Hetman. ANSWER: **Ivan** (That Hetman is Ivan Mazepa)

Answer some questions about the best Michael Cera movie. For 10 points each:

[10] In *The Lego Batman Movie*, this villain is the last in a long list said to be attacking the Gotham Energy Facility by Joker. This villain's minifigure wears actual underwear on the outside of his costume and his ketchup and mustard guns as shown in the movie have yet to be replicated in real life.

ANSWER: <u>Condiment King</u> [Accept <u>Buddy Standler</u>]

[10] During the opening battle against those villains, Batman states that he does not engage in this practice. In real life avoiding this practice is punishable by a fine of up to \$100,000 or up to five years in jail.

ANSWER: **Paying his taxes** [Accept equivalents]

[10] Due to Ralph Fiennes already voicing Alfred, Voldemort is instead voiced by this actor in the movie. This genderfluid actor also voiced Sir Miles Axlerod in *Cars 2*.

ANSWER: Suzy Eddie **Izzard** [accept either Suzy or Eddie for a first name]

Name some films set in Minnesota. For 10 Points each:

[10] Though the city this Coen Brothers film is named for isn't located in Minnesota, most of the action takes place in the state, with most characters using stereotypical accents. This film's famous woodchipper scene takes place at a cabin on Moose Lake.

ANSWER: Fargo

[10] This film set in Elk River stars Elliot Page as well as Michael Cera, who plays Paulie Bleeker. This film's titular character attempts to deal with an unplanned pregnancy and eventually chooses to let a couple from St. Cloud adopt the baby.

ANSWER: Juno

[10] Emilio Estevez plays Gordon Bombay in this movie set in Minneapolis. Forced to coach a youth hockey team for community service, he eventually leads the team to a state championship victory. The NHL franchise in Anaheim is named for this film's eponymous team.

ANSWER: The Mighty Ducks [Prompt on Ducks if someone jumps the gun, I suppose]

Surprise! It's another Cars 2 bonus! For 10 points each:

[10] This is the full name of the French rally car that participates in the World Grand Prix. His last name translates literally to "it rolls", and he shares his first name with a man created by Gaston Leroux. ANSWER: **Raoul CaRoule** [prompt on partial answers] [10] Instead of the familiar tractor tipping, Mater and Lightning are seen tipping one of these vehicles named Colossus XXL. In the real world, these vehicles are most commonly used in mining operations. ANSWER: **Haul Trucks** [prompt on dump truck]

[10] These two racing drivers cameo as World Grand Prix participants and talk with Lightning during the party in Tokyo. Despite one being an F1 driver and the other being a retired NASCAR racer, both are depicted as touring cars.

ANSWER: Lewis <u>Hamilton</u> AND Jeff <u>Gordon</u> [Prompt on partial answers; prompt on Jeff <u>Gorvette</u> by asking "what is his name in real life?"]

Answer the following about former NASCAR drivers in the *Cars* franchise. For 10 points each:

[10] This winningest NASCAR driver in history voiced The King in the first *Cars* movie. His son Kyle voiced Cal Weathers in *Cars* 3.

ANSWER: Richard Petty

[10] This retired driver voices a sportscaster in all three *Cars* movies. His character has the number 17 painted on his side in some appearances to, along with his color scheme, reflect this driver's iconic Tide car.

ANSWER: Darell Waltrip

[10] The much older former driver who voices Junior Moon, one of Doc's old moonshiner friends, in *Cars 3*, shares this last name with current NASCAR driver Jimmie, who does not appear in the *Cars* franchise. ANSWER: Johnson

I haven't seen either Angry Birds movie. Now answer some questions about them. For 10 points each: [10] Jojo Siwa voices this member of the Blues in *The Angry Birds Movie 2*. To make it easier on you, the other two Blues are named Jake and Jim.

ANSWER: Jay

This prolific video game voice actor voices Terence in *The Angry Birds Movie 2* and provided his singing voice in the first movie. This actor also voiced Deadpool in the 2013 game of the same name, as well as Nathan Drake in the *Uncharted Franchise*

ANSWER: Nolan North

[10] Smosh founders Ian and Anthony both voice characters in the first *Angry Birds* Movie, with Padilla reprising his role in the sequel. Name both of the characters voiced by the founders. These birds both appear in the original game as well.

ANSWER: **Bubbles** AND **Hal** [Prompt on <u>Boomerang bird</u> for Hal or <u>Orange bird</u> for Bubbles; Prompt on anything that sounds like they are attempting do describe the bird's appearance or abilities as long as they add "bird" after and the abilities/appearance line up with those of the characters in question]

Now answer some questions about the Fast and the Furious franchise. For 10 points each:

[10] What is the name of the fourth movie in the Fast and the Furious franchise?

ANSWER: Fast & Furious

[10] Name the sixth movie in the franchise.

ANSWER: Fast & Furious 6

[10] Now name the exact year and model of the car Brian uses in the first scene in 2 Fast 2 Furious. ANSWER: **1999 Nissan Skyline GT-R (R34)** [prompt on partial answers]

Name some Christopher Nolan films. For 10 points each:

[10] This 1998 film marks Nolan's directorial debut. This neo-noir thriller depicts a nameless protagonist who tails people on the streets of London.

ANSWER: Following

[10] This sci-fi film is Nolan's second most recent. It stars John David Washington as "The Protagonist", and also Robert Pattinson.

ANSWER: Tenet

[10] In *Dunkirk*, Harry Styles plays Alex, a member of this regiment in the British Army. In 2006, this regiment would be amalgamated into the Royal Regiment of Scotland. ANSWER: Argyll and Sutherland <u>Highlanders</u>

Alright it's time to ask about the extensive Quiz Bowl film canon. Name these members of the canon with clues of only 3 words. For 10 points each:

[10] Odessa Steps. Boat.
ANSWER: Battleship Potemkin
[10] Japanese director. Rashomon.
ANSWER: Akira Kurosawa
[10] Play it, Sam.
ANSWER: Casablanca

Ok now answer some questions about Oppenheimer, I guess.

[10] This is the full name of the man who attempts to recruit Oppenheimer into spying for the Soviet Union. Later in the film, it is revealed he ended up in France after being outed as a communist.

ANSWER: Haakon Chevalier

[10] Specific description required. In the film, the phrase "Now I am become death, destroyer of worlds" is first spoken in a scene where Oppenheimer is doing this activity.

ANSWER: **Having sex with Jean Tatlock** [Prompt on partial answers; prompt on <u>Florence Pugh</u> or <u>Florence Pu</u>

[10] In *Oppenheimer*, Seth Neddermeyer is portrayed by this actor. He is likely better known for playing Rodrick in the original *Diary of a Wimpy Kid* movies.

ANSWER: Devon Bostick

Peanuts movie bonus time! For 10 points each:

[10] Snoopy has this trait in *The Peanuts Movie*. He shares this trait with Doc Hudson in *Cars 3*, and is in contrast to his love interest Fifi, who is voiced by Kristin Chenoweth.

ANSWER: he is voiced using archival recordings

[10] This person is Charlie Brown's love interest. As in the comics, her real name is never revealed and she is instead referred to by a certain physical feature.

ANSWER: The Little Red-Haired Girl

[10] Meghan Trainor performed this song for the movie. It serves as the movie's lead single and plays over the credits. This song also went platinum four times in Australia, for some reason. ANSWER: <u>Better When I'm Dancin'</u>

You've heard of directors but what about what about women producers? For 10 points each:

[10] This person founded their own production company, *Cine-Tamaris*, to have more control over her own films including *One Sings, the Other Doesn't* and *Vagabond*.

ANSWER: <u>Agnes Varda</u> (Prompt on only Varda)

[10] This director of *Selma* and *13th* founded AFFRM or African-American Film Festival Releasing Movement which distributed films made by black filmmakers. She later rebranded the company to ARRAY with the promise to focus on women filmmakers as well.

ANSWER: Ava DuVernay

[10] This person produced the award-winning horror masterwork *From the Depths of Space*. Her other credits include *After Hours* and a cameo in *The Kettle*, which she was the assistant director for. ANSWER: **Haylee** Weisner

I hate minimalism. For 10 points each answer these questions about long titled movies

[10] This Stanley Kubrick satire follows the United States government trying to stop a B-52 from dropping a nuclear bomb on the Soviet Union. Peter Sellers famously plays three roles in this black comedy.

ANSWER: **Dr. Strangelove Or: How I Learned to Stop Worrying and Love the Bomb** (Prompt on any partial answers)

[10] This 1975 Belgian film was filmed on location over the period of 5 weeks despite only depicting three days. This film follows a housewife's daily schedule and currently holds the top spot in *Sight and Sound's* Greatest film's of all time poll.

ANSWER: Jeanne Dielman, 23 quai du Commerce, 1080 Bruxelles (Prompt on any partial answers)

[10] This 2006 mockumentary sees Sacha Baron Cohen play the titular character, a journalist sent to America at the behest of his home nation's Ministry of Information. This film prominently features real life interactions with people such as drunk University of South Carolina Students and Bob Barr

ANSWER: **Borat: Cultural Learnings of America for Make Benefit Glorious Nation of Kazakhstan** (Prompt on any partial answers)

For 10 points each, answer the following about cities in film that nobody should realistically have heard of. [10] Though most of the film was actually shot in nearby Bloomington, the Coen Brothers film *A Serious Man* was set in this city in Minnesota. This inner-ring suburb is also the hometown of one of the writers of this packet. ANSWER: <u>St. Louis Park</u> [neg them if they say St. Louis for some reason]

[10] *Killers of the Flower Moon* was primarily set in these two cities in Osage county. Though in real life the murders also occurred in the county seat of Pawhuska, these two cities are the only ones mentioned by name in the film.

ANSWER: Fairfax AND Gray Horse

[10] In the *Guardians of the Galaxy* films, Star-Lord is canonically from this ninth-largest city in Missouri. This city is most prominently featured in *Vol. 2*, where it is where Ego plants his seedling. This city is also shown to have a Dairy Queen.

ANSWER: St. Charles

I was easy on you with the first *Fast & Furious* bonus, so now you have to answer three more questions about the franchise. For 10 points each:

[10] This is the model of car Dom uses for most of the franchise. This vehicle is so iconic it has been turned into not one but two LEGO sets.

ANSWER: **Dodge Charger**

[10] Out of the first four Fast & Furious movies, this is the only one NOT to include a lesbian kiss.

ANSWER: 2 Fast 2 Furious

[10] In *The Fast and the Furious*, this is the name of the desert racing tournament Dom and Brian go to. At this tournament, Jesse attempts to race Johnny Tran for pink slips and loses, prompting Dom to leave the tournament and spark the film's climax.

ANSWER: Race Wars

Alright I guess you guys have been good, so here's a bonus about movie musicals. For 10 points each: [10] This musical biopic stars Hugh Jackman in the titular role. This movie has several historical fabrications, including the creation of Zach Efron's character Phillip Carlyle as well as an affair Jackman's character has with Jenny Lind.

ANSWER: The Greatest Showman

[10] This movie is based on a Jonathan Larson musical of the same name. This film's director makes a somewhat jarring cameo as a cook at the diner the protagonist works at during the song "Sunday".

ANSWER: Tick, Tick... Boom!

[10] This film was the only one of its trilogy to be released in theaters. This film's female lead also appears as Karessa in *Tick, Tick... Boom!*, and other characters in this film include the British wannabe Tiara Gold and a freshman basketball player with the nickname "Rocket Man".

ANSWER: High School Musical 3: Senior Year

Brazil is a good movie. It's also a place. For 10 points each:

[10] This film which takes place in a suburb of Rio de Janeiro opens with a gang chasing after a chicken. The actor who played Knockout Ned in this film later became a famous musician Seu Jorge.

ANSWER: City of God

[10] This film's male lead spends the majority of the movie in Brazil, away from most of the action. This film's protagonist then begins experiencing hallucinations of that character when she does dangerous things, leading her to repair dirt bikes with another character.

ANSWER: Twilight New Moon

[10] Though born in Brazil, the protagonist of this Blue Sky film grows up in Moose Lake, Minnesota. He later returns to Brazil after learning he is the last male of his species. ANSWER: **Rio**

Any Jim Carey fans? For 10 points each:

[10] City and state required. This city is where Sonic ends up after coming to earth. This city's namesake is the first level of the original *Sonic the Hedgehog* game.

ANSWER: Green Hills, Montana

[10] These are the full names of the couple that take Sonic in after they discover him in their garage. These two characters are played by James Marsden and Tika Sumpter, and work as a police officer and a veterinarian respectively. They also have a golden retriever named Ozzy.

ANSWER: <u>Tom</u> AND <u>Maddie Wachowski</u> [accept <u>Donut Lord</u> in place of Tom and <u>Pretzel Lady</u> in place of Maddie, I guess]

[10] This character makes a non-speaking cameo in the mid-credits scene of *Sonic the Hedgehog 2*. If nobody gets this you will be collectively negged 20 points.

ANSWER: Shadow the Hedgehog

Answer some questions about the nation of Scotland's greatest contribution to humanity, David Tennant. For 10 points each:

[10] Tennant might be best known film-wise for portraying this villain in the Harry Potter franchise.

ANSWER: **<u>Barty Crouch Jr.</u>** [prompt on partial answers; do not accept or prompt on Barty Crouch sr.] [10] In *Mary, Queen of Scots*, Tennant portrays this founder of the Scottish Presbyterian Church, who works against the queen to secure protestantism in Scotland.

ANSWER: John Knox

[10] In 2022's *Chip'n Dale: Rescue Rangers*, Tennant makes a brief cameo voicing this character, whom he voiced on television from 2017 to 2021. In the movie, this character is drawn as he was for his original show, which aired in the 1980s.

ANSWER: Scrooge McDuck

Now that you've answered that tossup about peak cinema, answer this bonus about PEAKER cinema. For 10 points each:

[10] The Luma that appears in *The Super Mario Bros. Movie* subscribes to this school of thought. An earlier follower of this school of thought is the main character of an Ivan Turgenev novel.

ANSWER: <u>Nihilism</u> [accept word forms] (that novel is *Fathers and Sons*)

[10] Alongside some Shy Guys, one of these creatures helps capture Luigi after he is separated from Mario. Unlike the Shy Guys, this creature has a speaking role, where they tell Bowser that they "found [Luigi] in the darklands". ANSWER: <u>Snifits</u> [prompt on <u>shy guy with gas mask</u>]

[10] This song was originally composed for the scene where Mario and Peach are driven to see Cranky Kong, but in the final film this song was cut and replaced with "Take on Me". This song, which is now only available on the movie soundtrack, is arguably one of the best tracks composed for *The Super Mario Bros. Movie*. ANSWER: **Drivin' Me Bananas**

Answer some questions about some locations from the *Twilight* franchise, most of which Haylee has not visited. For 10 points each:

[10] After informing the Cullens of James' ambition to kill Bella, Laurent briefly joined a coven named for this geographical feature. Several members of that vegetarian coven named for this feature would later show up in Forks during the events of *Breaking Dawn: Part 2*.

ANSWER: **Denali** [Accept **Denali Coven**; prompt on Mount McKinley]

[10] The shots showing the exterior of Forks High School are actually shots of the high school in this city. This city along the Columbia is notable for some other things, maybe.

ANSWER: Kalama

[10] Bella moving to Forks in the first *Twilight* film is in part caused by Renée and Phil deciding to move from Phoenix to this other city. Edward and Bella later visit Renée in this city in *Eclipse*. ANSWER: Jacksonville, Florida

NOTE TO MODERATOR: at the very least read up to "it's a sith legend" on the lead-in, but I think it would be funny to read the whole thing. Also if willing please read doing an impression of Emperor Palpatine. Did you ever hear the tragedy of Darth Plagueis, The Wise? I thought not. It's not a story the Jedi would tell you. It's a Sith legend. Darth Plagueis was a Dark Lord of the Sith, so powerful and so wise he could use the Force to influence the midichlorians to create life... He had such a knowledge of the dark side that he could even keep the ones he cared about from dying. The dark side of the Force is a pathway to many abilities some consider to be unnatural. He became so powerful... the only thing he was afraid of was losing his power, which eventually, of course, he did. Unfortunately, he taught his apprentice everything he knew, then his apprentice killed him in his sleep. Ironic. He could save others from death, but not himself. For 10 points each:

[10] Many of the scenes on Ahch-To were shot on this island. Footage of this UNESCO World Heritage Site was used in all three sequel trilogy films, however *Rise of Skywalker* only shot aerial footage.

ANSWER: **Skellig Michael** [accept **Great Skellig**; accept the irish translation I am too lazy to write out] [10] A member of this species named Joh Yowza was a member of the Max Rebo band in an extended scene from *Return of the Jedi*. This species was originally meant to be shown on its home planet of Endor in the film, however they proved expensive and were only shown using CGI in later editions of the film. ANSWER: **Yuzzums**

[10] This is the name of the Druk Jedi that attacks Count Dooku during the battle of Geonosis. This Jedi is easily dispatched by Jango Fett, and he was made into a LEGO minifigure for the 2013 AT-TE.

ANSWER: Coleman Trebor [prompt on partial answers]

A character in this film regains some of his trust in humans after being given a chocolate bar. For 10 points each: [10] Name this film, the last in its franchise to be dubbed by 4kids. The main protagonist of this film kickstarts the plot after assuming a certain pose and unintentionally releasing a creature who was sealed in a staff for hundreds of years.

ANSWER: Pokémon: Lucario and the Mystery of Mew

[10] In contrast to *Mewtwo Strikes Back*, Pikachu ends up turning to stone at the climax of this Pokémon movie, whose titular Pokémon attempts to repair the Heart Diamond. This is the first Pokémon movie to feature the cast of the *Pokémon X and Y* anime.

ANSWER: Pokémon the Movie: Diancie and the Cocoon of Destruction

[10] There is only one instance of there being a Pokémon movie being split into two versions to showcase both box legendaries of a generation. Name both of those movies, both of which also feature Victini.

ANSWER: Pokémon the Movie: <u>Black — Victini and Reshiram</u> AND Pokémon the Movie: <u>White — Victini and</u> <u>Zekrom</u>

NOTE TO PLAYERS: All answers must be in original language.

Time to test your world knowledge for 10 points answer these questions about foreign films [10] This Andrei Tarkovsky film based on the book *Roadside Picnic* follows three different people as they venture into the mysterious "Zone."

ANSWER: <u>Сталкер</u> (Stalker with russian accent)

[10] This 1960 film sees one character model himself off of the persona of Humphrey Bogart and get chased by police due to stealing a car. He eventually falls in love with an American who sells the New York Herald Tribune in Paris.

ANSWER: À bout de souffle

[10] This 1997 Iranian film shared the Palme d'Or with a film titled the Eel. This film, which is primarily composed of long takes, sees a man named Mr. Badiii drive through Tehran looking for someone to do a job for him. ANSWER: طعم گیلاس (Ta'm-e gīlās)

Conservapedia is a right wing propaganda knock off of the website Wikipedia. For 10 points answer these questions about films that appear on its Greatest Conservative Movies List and Worst Liberal Movies list.

[10] This 2020 film makes a surprise appearance on the Greatest Conservative Movies list with a description stating this film is "chronically misinterpreted by liberal critics" as the supposed true message of this 2020 best picture winner is that liberals are the true title organism.

ANSWER: Parasite

[10] This 1946 partially animated partially live action disney film also makes an appearance on the Greatest Conservative Movies list. This film, often criticized for being horribly racist, is praised by Conservapedia for teaching children to listen to their parents and being anti-lying.

ANSWER: Song of the South

[10] This 1935 film is cited as one of the Worst Liberal Movies due to it being the most infamous Nazi propaganda film and that Nazis were in ""truth"" left-wing according to Conservapedia ANSWER: **Triumph of the Will**

You know what they say, no times better than your first. For 10 points each:

[10] This director's directorial debut was the short film *I Killed My Lesbian Wife, Hung Her on a Meat Hook, and Now I Have a Three-Picture Deal at Disney.* This director would later state that it looks like the person who made the film would have no prospects despite eventually winning the Oscar for Best Picture 20 years later.

ANSWER: **Ben Affleck** (Prompt on Affleck)

[10] This director's feature length debut premiered at the 2008 Cannes film festival where he won the Camera d'Or award. That film features a 17 ½ minute long continuous shot where a priest and a prisoner have a discussion. ANSWER: <u>Steve Mcaueen</u>

[10] This 1971 film was the directorial debut of George Lucas and is based on his own short film *Electronic Labyrinth*. This film partially shares its title with the name of the sound company he co founded most recognizable for the Deep Note played during the company's trailers.

ANSWER: THX 1138 (Prompt on THX)

Minimalism is stupid but sometimes to say how you truly feel its better to use fewer words. For 10 points each name these terms used to slander certain kinds of films

[10] One of the first uses of this term was in a 1948 review of the film *Fort Apache* used in the context of a character in the film sending postcards. This term generally refers to film purposefully made to seek and attract nominations in the Academy Awards.

ANSWER: Oscar-Bait

[10] This term was used in a tweet from a now suspended account stating that "Nerds dont deserve to have Sam Raimi directing this term again." This term typically refers to superheroes and comic book movies in a negative light.

ANSWER: Capeshit

[10] Films such as *Pocahontas 2: Journey to the New World, The Return of Jafar, and The Lion King 1 ¹/₂* are all examples of this type of film categorized by the way in which the film was released. ANSWER: **Direct to DVD** sequels (Accept **Direct to video** or **Straight to Video**)

Films are old as fuck. Some would say old as dirt. For 10 points each:

[10] This series of cabinet cards was shot by Eadweard Muybridge and shows the title animal trotting very fast. Its often credited as the start of cinema despite their being earlier examples using similar technology.

ANSWER: The Horse in Motion

[10] This Lumiere Brothers 1895 film is a total of 50 seconds long and is depicted in the film *Hugo*. It has been mythologized that this film caused viewers to scream and become overwhelmed by the moving title object depicted in the film.

ANSWER: L'Arrivée d'un train en gare de La Ciotat or <u>The Arrival of a Train at La Ciotat</u> or <u>The Arrival of</u> the Mail Train or <u>Train Pulling into a Station</u>

[10] This director originally offered the Lumiere Brothers 10,000 francs for one of their cinematographs which he was refused. He would later go on to create such films as *The Haunted Castle, The Magician,* and *A Trip to the Moon*.

ANSWER: (Georges Méliès)

Have you guys ever read Giovanni's Room? The protagonist is an ass and even worse he's in love with an Italian. For 10 points each:

This is the full onscreen title of *The French Dispatch*. This title more clearly references the title publication's origin in the American heartland.

[10] The French Dispatch of the Liberty, Kansas Evening Sun [prompt on partial answers]

Though it was shot in Angoulême, a real French town, the film is set in this fictional French city. The film's first vignette consists of an Owen Wilson-played reporter cycling around this town and describing its "culture".

ANSWER: Ennui-sur-Blasé

[10] *The French Dispatch* consists of several vignettes, with the majority of the film being dedicated to three, which are sandwiched by the shorter "The Cycling Reporter" and "Obituary". Name all three of the journalists who are the narrators for those three vignettes.

ANSWER: J.K.L. Berensen, Lucinda Krementz, AND Roebuck Wright [prompt on partial answers]

For 10 points each, answer these questions about Oscar-nominated George W. Bush impersonator, Sam Rockwell: [10] Rockwell played this inmate at Cold Mountain Penitentiary in *The Green Mile*. This "psychotic" criminal is, spoilers for a thirty year old movie, the real perpetrator of the crimes for which John Coffey is on death row. ANSWER: <u>William Wharton</u> [accept <u>Wild Bill Wharton</u>]

[10] Rockwell won an Academy Award for his portrayal of officer Jason Dixon in this crime drama, which is based on a novel of the same name.

ANSWER: Three Billboards Outside Ebbing, Missouri

[10] Rockwell's arguably greatest role is that of Darwin, a leader of this film's titular field team. This film also features Nicholas Cage as Speckles, the star-nosed mole. ANSWER: <u>G-Force</u>

A Stephen King book seems to be adapted every month but how about the ones everybody forgets For 10 points each

[10] This Stephen King adaptation has a soundtrack entirely made by the rock band AC/DC and was directed by the man himself. The film features a deadly semi-truck with a large green goblin mask attached to the front and is based on the short story *Trucks*.

ANSWER: Maximum Overdrive

[10] This Stephen King short story was adapted into a 1984 film and spawned an entire film franchise. Films in this franchise include the subtitles Isaac's Return, The Gathering, and Urban Harvest.

ANSWER: Children of the Corn

[10] This short film was written by Stephen King which sees one singer play 5 separate rolls and dance to songs such as 2 *Bad, Is it Scary*, and the titular track. This short film was released in 1996 along with certain prints of the film *Thinner*.

ANSWER: Michael Jackson's Ghosts (Prompt on Ghosts)

What do you call a frame story inside a frame story inside a frame story? Well if you're Wes Anderson in 2014 you call it *The Grand Budapest Hotel*. For 10 points each:

[10] The hotel is situated in this fictional Eastern European country. This country seems to endure the worst of 20th century Europe throughout the film, including fascist and communist takeovers.

ANSWER: <u>Zubrowka</u>

[10] Much of the inspiration for *Grand Budapest* came from Anderson studying the work of this writer. This author wrote the memoir *The World of Yesterday*, as well as the nonfiction *Brazil, World of the Future*. ANSWER: Stefan Zweig

[10] Zero's love interest in *Grand Budapest*, Agatha, has a birthmark that looks strikingly similar to this country. This country is also the setting of a B. Traven novel that was later turned into a Humphrey Bogart movie. ANSWER: <u>Mexico</u>

Religion is awesome & it's even more fun in video form. For 10 points each, answer these questions about religious movies & works.

[M] This 2004 film rather accurately portrays Christ's final days, despite using writings beyond the biblical canon. This film's director, Mel Gibson, predominantly credits the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John as sources for this film.

ANSWER: Passion of the Christ

[E] This franchise never portrayed Jesus' crucifixion, opting instead to teach the Christian Faith using foods, as can be seen when this franchise depicts Larry the Cucumber leading an altered version of The Exodus. ANSWER: VeggieTales

[H] In 2014, Netflix rebooted VeggieTales, and has since gone on to produce other projects, such as Stories of a Generation, which predominantly features Pope Francis, with a guest appearance from this director. ANSWER: Martin Scorsese

Although he features in two films, this character's first appearance was in the *Mater's Tall Tales* episode "Air Mater" as a flight instructor. For 10 points each:

[h] Skipper flew his only combat mission at Glendal Canal with this navy squadron. Bravo and Echo are two F/A-18s from this squadron that are stationed on the USS *Dwight D. Flysenhower*. ANSWER: the **_Jolly Wrenches__** [accept **_VF-17__**; accept **_VF-84__**; accept **_VF-86__**; accept **_VF-103__**] [e] Skipper is a supporting character from this 2013 movie by DisneyToons Studios, a spinoff "from above the world of *Cars*."

ANSWER: ***_Planes__*** [reject "*Planes: Fire & Rescue*"]

In this film, Diana tests Sameer's abilities by speaking multiple different languages but butchers the Chinese line, "Your eyes, they look like they want something," to which Sameer poorly and ironically replies, "I know Chinese too, little girl." For 10 points each:

[h] Video essayist Accented Cinema compared the jarring effect of bad Chinese dialogue to this English quote from *Kung Fu Hustle*. Donut says this line shortly before dying after a fight with the Harpists, a reference to Malone's death from *The Untouchables*.

ANSWER: ** *"What are you... prepared... to do"* **

TRON: Legacy is iconic for its unique visual depiction of the Grid. For 10 points each, answer some questions about events that happen in the real world.

[h] In the film, Sam Flynn is revealed to be the majority shareholder in this Fortune 500 tech company, which formerly employed his father Kevin during the original *TRON* film. The rivalry between Dillinger and Flynn in the original film spills over into *Legacy*, with Dillinger Jr. being one of this company's lead engineers. ANSWER: **_ENCOM__**

[hh] Description acceptable. Near the start of the film, Sam breaks into ENCOM headquarters in order to do this specific action. While conducting this action, he makes a video of his dog Marv appear in the ENCOM executives' office.

ANSWER: **__Releasing___** ENCOM **__O__**perating **__S__**ystem 12 for **__free__** [accept any vague description that seems to encompass this general idea]

[m] While he is unable to save his father, Sam brings this character back into the real world at the end of the film, where she witnesses her first sunset. This ISO [EYE-soh] was Kevin Flynn's only companion in the Grid after CLU's takeover.

ANSWER: **__Quorra__**
