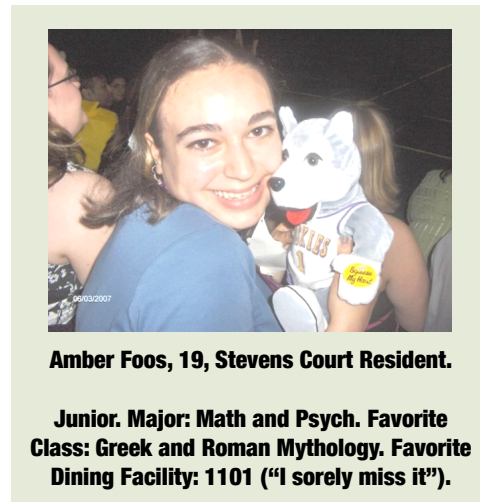
Amber Foes, AD of Publicity.
